


Philanthropy in Action

HonorHealth Research Institute gives patients like Dale hope, often when it seems like there is none.

Dale is an oncology research patient at the Institute, where Dr. Michael Gordon is actively treating him in a follow-up program for a malignant peripheral neural sheath tumor, a rare type of cancer. He recently had the opportunity to personally thank his physician and the team.



"The HonorHealth Research Institute sets the bar high," said Dale with warmth and sincere gratitude. "I'm honored to be part of something that saves lives. I saw participating in research as an opportunity to help others and to help my future."

Six years after enrolling in a clinical trial combination study, his cancer is undetectable.

"We make a difference in the lives of patients who have been given the most devastating news of their lives, and that is what drives us forward," says Dr. Gordon.

Addressing food insecurity in our community

HonorHealth <u>Desert Mission Food Bank</u> recently partnered with Canyon Community Kitchen and the Nutrition Club to distribute 900 free bags of nonperishable food to Grand Canyon University (GCU) students.

According to a 2022, Health Affairs article, before the pandemic, a staggering 30 percent of all college students experienced food insecurity at some point in their college careers.

Those numbers appear to be even more dire in Arizona. An Arizona Board of Regents report from 2021, which surveyed 167,000 Arizona college students noted that 44



percent of them suffered from high food insecurity, and that some students admitted to not eating on certain days because they didn't have the money to purchase food.

Thanks to the kindness and compassion of our donors, the food distribution was open to not just GCU students, but anyone who works on campus. Several staff members were thrilled to receive the food bags as well.

HonorHealth breaks ground to meet growing need in the West Valley

The HonorHealth system serves more than 1.6 million people in the greater Phoenix and Scottsdale area. CEO Todd LaPorte joined the Deer Valley family and community leaders for a groundbreaking ceremony to mark the start of an expansion project at



HonorHealth Deer Valley Medical Center. The project will feature additional patient beds and operating rooms and will expand infrastructure for key support departments.

"Our commitment to expanding the <u>HonorHealth Deer Valley Medical Center</u> campus is critical to help us support the needs of the growing north Phoenix community and provide them with access to high-quality care close to home," said LaPorte. "By continuing to invest in key services and providing infrastructure to help us expand, both now and in the future, we will be able to grow alongside our community."

The expansion, located at 19829 N. 27th Avenue in Phoenix, will be completed in three phases with construction scheduled to begin this summer. The entire project is slated for completion in 2025.
